

DANGEROUS GOODS

Prohibited, restricted and dangerous goods are articles or substances that are capable of posing a risk to health, safety, property or the environment. If you wish to travel with any such goods or material, please be aware of the restrictions or steps you may have to take.

PROHIBITED ON BOARD



Device with paralyzing effect ("Taser", teargas grenade, etc.)
Includes device containing explosives or compressed gases



Briefcases with installed alarm



Fireworks



Explosives



Flammable liquids



Flammable solids



Poisons and infectious substances

CARRIED ON THE PERSON ONLY



Disposable or Zippo-type lighters
Shall not contain any unabsorbed liquid fuel (other than liquefied gas). Lighter fuel and lighter refills are not permitted on one's person nor in checked or carry-on baggage.



Safety matches
Only one small box per person.



Pharmaceuticals containing radioactive materials
Authorised only when taken for medical reasons.

AUTHORISED IN BAGGAGE COMPARTMENT (PROHIBITED IN CABIN)



Sharp or pointed objects (knives, scissors, etc.)



Blunt objects (clubs, baseball bats, truncheons, etc.)



Firearms and ammunition (including toys and replicas)



Work tools (drills, saws, sealing guns, etc.)



Ammunitions for hunting and sporting weapons
In quantities less than 5 kg (11 lb) gross weight per person for that person's own use, excluding ammunition with explosive or incendiary projectiles.



Aerosols with no subsidiary risk, for sporting or home use.
Total net quantity must not exceed 2 kg (4.4 lb) or 2 L, and the net quantity of each single article must not exceed 0.5 kg (1 lb) or 0.5L.

AUTHORISED IN CABIN (PROHIBITED IN BAGGAGE COMPARTMENT)



Gyropods, hoverboards
Equipped with lithium batteries whose energy ! 100Wh.



E-cigarettes and vaporizers containing lithium batteries
Shall be protected against inadvertent activation



Wheelchairs or other battery-powered mobility devices
Only devices equipped with removable lithium batteries (should be removed during flight).



Spare lithium batteries
Shall be protected against short- circuits.
- Used in medical devices: E ! 100Wh (lithium ion batteries) or M ! 2g (lithium metal batteries).
- Used in Portable Electronic Devices: E ! 100Wh or M ! 2g.
- 2 spare batteries only.

AUTHORISED BUT REGULATED IN CABIN AND BAGGAGE COMPARTMENT



Lithium batteries
It is advisable to transport batteries contained in portable electronic devices in the cabin.
- Used in medical devices: E ! 100Wh (lithium ion batteries) or M ! 2g (lithium metal batteries).
- Used in portable electronic devices: E ! 100Wh or M ! 2g.



Hair curlers containing hydrocarbon gas
Up to one per passenger, provided that the safety cover is securely fitted over the heating element.
These hair curlers must not be used on board the aircraft at any time. Gas refills for such curlers are not permitted in checked or carry- on baggage.



Gas
- Gas cylinder for medical use: gross weight ! 5kg (11lb). Liquid oxygen forbidden.
- Carbon dioxide gas cylinders worn for the operation of mechanical limbs.
Also, spare cylinders of a similar size if required to ensure an adequate supply for the duration of the journey.




Alcohol containing between 24% and 70% of alcohol volume

Net quantity per person of 5 L.



Non-radioactive medicinal or toilet articles (including aerosols)

Total net quantity must not exceed 2kg (4.4lb) or 2 L, and the net quantity of each single article must not exceed 0.5 kg (1 lb) or 0.5 L.



Medical or clinical thermometer containing mercury

One per passenger for personal use, when in its protective case.



Magnetised materials

Only magnetised materials with a field strength ! 0,00525 Gauss at a distance of 4.6m are authorised. Must be located in locations minimising possible effects on aircraft compasses.

When multiple magnetised materials are transported, their cumulative effect must be taken into consideration.
